

## **Presentation of Final Year Project**

### **Semester 2 Session 20192020**

**5 April 2020**

#### **Introduction**

This document outlines the presentation for both PSM1 and PSM2, and the hardbound thesis submission for PSM2 for Semester 2 of Session 20192020. This guideline is ONLY applicable for this semester if the Movement Control Order (MCO) is still in application.

#### **Presentation**

- i. Presentation dates is moved forward to allow students and supervisors ample time to produce quality project results. New dates are reflected on PSM Calendar available on PSM website.
- ii. Presentation *preferably* will be in face-to-face mode.
  - a. If MCO is lifted and travels are allowed, presentation will be physical face-to-face in UTM.
  - b. If MCO or travel restrictions are still applied, presentation will be real-time face-to-face using any feasible technology like Zoom, Webex or Whatsapp, among others.
  - c. Please always be ready and alert for whichever change that may occur and news updated.
- iii. PSM1 students are required (COMPULSORY) to [prepare and submit a presentation video](#) that clearly shows all elements of your presentation. This is apart from the 2-minute reflection video required previously. (\*Note: That means you have to do TWO videos).
- iv. PSM2 students are required (COMPULSORY) to [prepare and submit a clear demo of your project and a presentation of your project](#). You are advised to show clearly all the pertinent aspects of your project.

#### **Hardbound thesis submission**

- i. PSM2 students MUST submit hardbound of their thesis before you can graduate. Failure to do so will get you a TS (*Tidak Selesai* – Incomplete), and you cannot graduate.
- ii. If MCO or travel restrictions are still applied, you have, in current situation, ONE WEEK after restrictions are lifted to either send your hardbound thesis by hand or by post to the Academic Office of School of Computing.
  - a. As your hometown printing companies may not have the standards required by the university, I suggest your contact the Printing Company in Skudai (Rainbow, Lily, JasaMax, etc) to find out.

- b. Any updates on this matter (submission during MCO) will be updated to you via the PSM website and/or WA groups.
- c. Please pay close attentions to updates from PSM Committee regarding PSM matters, issues and news.

### **Advice**

It is hard to be on your own, but please do:

1. Have a structured work timeline so you may progress in your PSM.
2. It is a good time to use a blog as your logbook. You can share with your friends and get feedback on questions, you can also share with your SV and they can monitor you. Remember your SV also have many worries during MCO. Let's work together positively.
3. Carve a time for PSM while you are online attending classes, doing assignments.
4. Do not forget to write. Writing is important, and let us be honest; you people are not the best of writers in the best of times. A little a day, that is all it takes.
